Procurement Fitness Checks

- Assessment against Procurement Maturity Model
- All local authorities completed reviews
- NHS, HE and FE commencing from March
- Recommendations and action plan
- Some emerging themes
- Access to support vital

Project Bank Accounts

- What?
 - Ring fenced back account with trust status from which payments are made directly and simultaneously by a client to members of his supply chain
- Why?
 - There is a payment problem.
- When?
 - Early pilots identified, procurement policy to be published by Spring
- Who?
 - Welsh public sector

Community Benefits

- Programme for Government, LG Compact, Tackling Poverty, WPPS, Construction Procurement Strategy
- Applied across 80 projects in excess of £4.3bn
- Embedded in all major frameworks
- Measurement is critical (and a requirement!)
 - 27 completed projects measured 84% of £346m reinvested in Wales, some 517 disadvantaged people were helped into employment, receiving over 13,020 weeks of training.

EU Procurement Directives (1)

- Two year exercise to modernise
- Adopted by EU Parliament January 2014
- Awaiting adoption by European Council
- UK plans rapid transposition

EU Procurement Directives (2)

- Significant changes
 - reserved contracts
 - restricting number of lots
 - scope for negotiation
 - inclusion of social and environmental considerations
 - capping turnover requirements
 - past performance
 - abnormally low bids
 - require use of e-procurement
 - flexible use of selection and award criteria
