# What is it?

- A Hub and Spoke arrangement for the construction industry in Wales launched 12th April 2016
- In the planning for over 13 years
- The 3 year project is financed by CITB with match funding from UWTSD
- Training is free for eligible individuals and companies
- An intent to support the project for 10 years
- The Hub will form part of the new UWTSD Campus at SA1

# How will it operate?

- The Hub will be based in Swansea (SA1)
- Different to the National Construction Colleges in the rest of the UK
- Deliver any level from 1 to 7 in specialist construction activities and NOT already offered in sufficient volume or quality by existing providers or their supplier networks
- Hub to include a <u>scaffolding centre and</u> <u>Constructionarium</u> and ready by <u>September 2018</u>
- £2M revenue allocated over the 3 years in the Hub and Spokes


