







# Construction Procurement North Wales (CPNW): Update Paper September 2012

## • Introduction

- The CPNW project is set up as a collaborative project with the 6 North Wales authorities led by Flintshire and Denbighshire County Councils.
- AIM: To provide a simple, easy to use and transparent process to manage and deliver the schools construction programmes collaboratively in North Wales.
   The primary objective is to create a new bespoke procurement vehicle by Summer 2013,

tendered via the OJEU process, which allows the participating local authorities to instruct construction activities. That provides a lean and efficient process that is cost effective and delivers a project (building) that is fit for purpose.

### • Project Summary

The project is currently in consultation stages and has engaged with officers across the 6 authorities, and Chief Executives Officers. A Procurement Options Report was considered by the Chief Executives Forum North Wales, on 13.9.12. Following Welsh Governments clarification that a framework approach is favoured and required to access the 21<sup>st</sup> Century Schools Programme funding, the CEO's supported the officer recommendation to progress to the next stage in the process; which is to seek consultation of key stakeholders on the proposal to develop a high value framework (over £4.35m) and develop a regional standardised approach to procure projects below this level. The next step is to consult with the Construction industry and key stakeholders to inform the approach and assist with the development of the Procurement Plan, which will set out the detail of how the approach will be delivered, implemented and managed.

#### • Strategy for engagement with the Construction Industry

Construction industry will be consulted the help and assistance of Value Wales and Constructing Excellence Wales and Construction Skills, it is anticipated that this will be carried out via a questionnaire and workshops open to the whole construction industry.

A date for the workshop will be issued in due course with a questionnaire being issued in advance of the workshop so as to inform the workshops. The feedback from the industry will be used to inform the Procurement Plan.

CEO NW Forum	Chief Executive Officer North Wales Forum: Group convened by Welsh Local Government Association, forum meeting of the 6 North Wales authorities Chief Executives.
